How to Become a Narcan Distribution Site

For Community Organizations in California

The Naloxone Distribution Project (NDP), from the California Department of Public Health, aims to reduce opioid overdose deaths through the provision of **free** naloxone (Narcan). Since it began in October 2018, the NDP has distributed more than 2,100,000 kits of naloxone, which have been used to reverse more than 135,000 overdoses.

- 1. Complete and save the NDP Application (tinyurl.com/NDPapplicaiton)
- Get a standing order for Naloxone by completing this application (tinyurl.com/NDPstandingorder). When you click submit, it will generate a document that you can save as a PDF of word document. Save this document.
- 3. Create a distribution plan. This is a document detailing how you plan to distribute narcan, and what communities you will be serving. It should also include a plan for how you will track the usage of narcan.
- 4. Submit materials by email to naloxone@dhcs.ca.gov. You will need to submit
 - The NDP Application
 - A copy of the standing order document from step two.
 - Your distribution plan
- 5. In subsequent applications, you will need to provide all of these documents, in addition to providing the number of overdose reversals reported with naloxone received through NDP.
